Tie them around your neck as a reminder. Write them deep within your heart. **4** Then you will find favor with both God and people, and you will earn a good reputation. **5** Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. **6** Seek his will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take.

### 1. The Importance of Knowledge

Proverbs 1:7 (NLT) Fear of the Lord is the foundation of true knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline

**Hosea 4:6 (ESV)** My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge. Because you have rejected knowledge, I will reject you from being a priest to Me.

Proverbs 18:15 (NLT) Intelligent people are always ready to learn. Their ears are open for knowledge.

Consider the story of Daniel. Taken into exile, he immersed himself in learning and wisdom, excelling in knowledge that set him apart. His dedication to education not only benefited him but also served a greater purpose in the kingdom.

#### 2. The Role of Discipline / structure in Learning

**Il Timothy 2:15 (NLT)** Work hard so you can present yourself to God and receive His approval. Be a good worker, one who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly explains the word of truth.

Think of Thomas Edison, who faced numerous failures before inventing the light bulb. His discipline and persistence in learning from mistakes exemplify how embracing correction and hard work can lead to remarkable breakthroughs.

## 3. The importance of Community in Growth

Proverbs 27:17 (NLT) As iron sharpens iron, so a friend sharpens a friend.

**Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 (NLT)** Two people are better off than one, for they can help each other succeed. If one person falls, the other can reach out and help.

**Romans 12:4-5 (NLT)** Just as our bodies have many parts and each part has a special function, so it is with Christ's body. We are many parts of one body, and we all belong to each other.

In the early church, believers gathered together, sharing knowledge and encouraging one another in their faith. Their commitment to community fostered personal and spiritual growth, demonstrating the power of collective learning.

#### 4. The Pursuit of Lifelong Learning
